## **Checklist for Adult Name Change**

**Step 1: Prepare Court Forms.** Complete the court forms then make 2 copies of each form. You must include the name of the newspaper for publication on the Order to Show Cause for Change of Name (Form NC-120).

**Step 2: File Court Forms.** Options during pandemic: 1) Drop Box, 2) US Mail or 3) Fax Filing. Include Request to Waive Court Fees or \$435 court filing fee.

**Step 3: Publication.** Take a court-stamped copy of the Order to Show Cause for Change of Name (Form NC-120) to the newspaper for publication. Pay the newspaper's private publication fee.

**Step 4: Proof of Publication.** After the publication is complete, confirm that the newspaper filed the Proof of Publication with the Court. Check the Court's website <u>www.lacourt.org</u> select "Find A Case" then enter your case number. If the Proof of Publication has not been filed contact the newspaper.

**Step 5: Attend Court Hearing.** Bring court stamped copies of your documents. Be prepared to explain why you want to change your name. If there are problems with your case, you may ask the judge a new hearing date.

**Step 6: Get Certified Copies Name Change Court Order.** After your name change request has been approved by the judge, obtain certified copies of Name Change Decree (Form NC-130) from the court clerk.

**Step 7: Change Your Name in Government & Business Records.** Contact government agencies & businesses to request name change in official records. If you were born in California and want to amend your birth certificate, contact the California Department of Public Health (<u>www.cdph.ca.gov</u>.) for the Form VS-23 instructional packet "Amending a Birth Certificate after a Court Order Name Change".
